Re: Update on the 60th Annual Board of Delegates Meeting

Back in April, I wrote to you that our Board of Directors would be making a decision regarding whether our 60th Annual Board of Delegates meeting, scheduled for July 27-29 in Madison, Wisconsin, would be held in person or virtually.

We met this week and, considering restrictions currently in place in Madison and around the country, decided that our meeting this summer will be held virtually. Presently, the authorities in Madison have not outlined a plan that would allow a meeting of our size in July.
