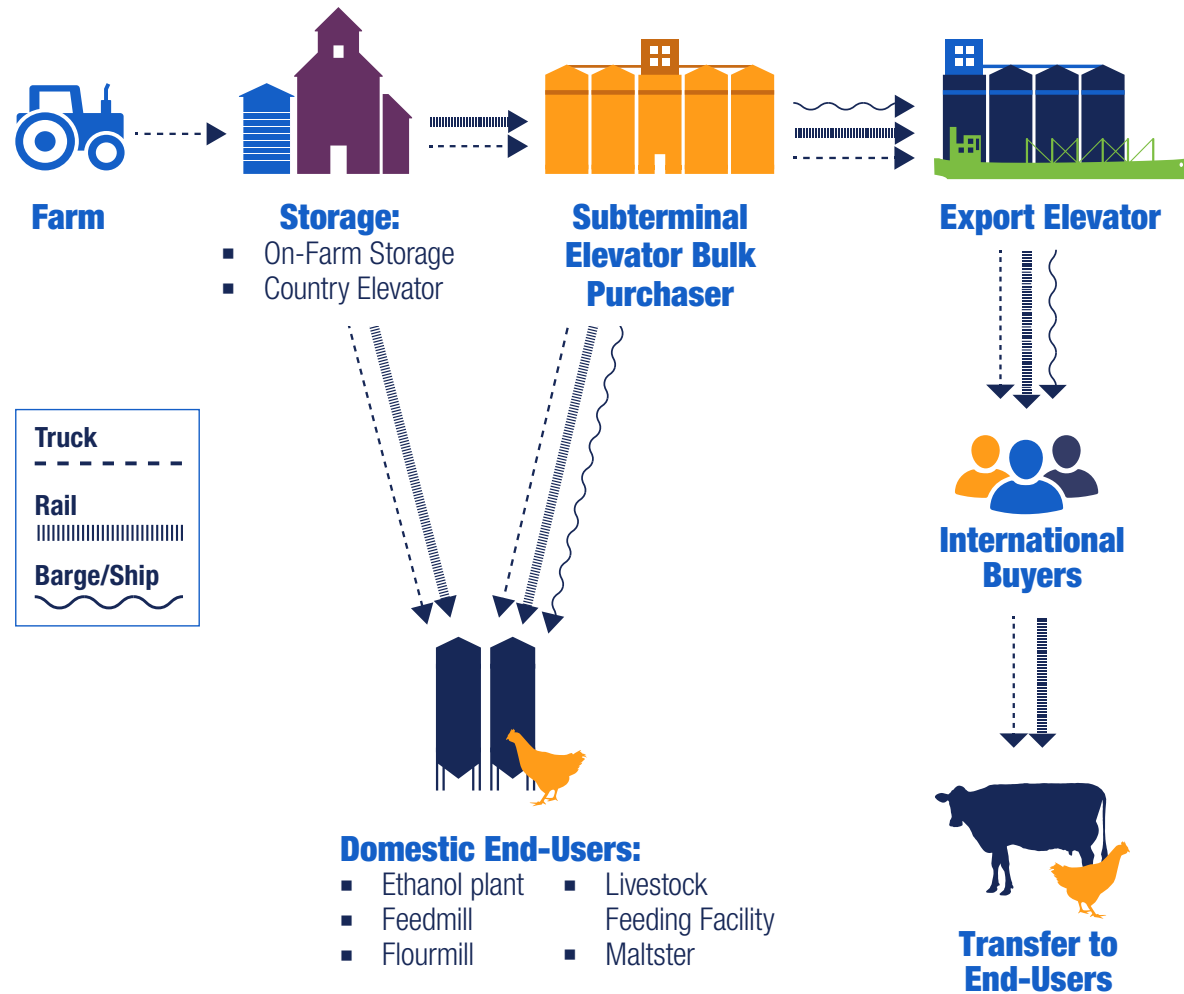


How Does U.S. Grain Move?
